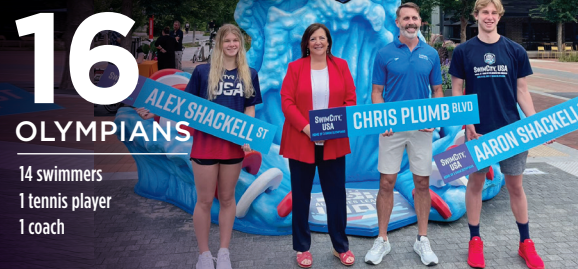
Taxpayer savings of \$500K thanks to refinanced debt to a more stable and lower cost source of funds without extending terms
