Many leaders are making this type of training a top priority in their communities. This **MUST ATTEND** training was designed specifically for Public Safety Personnel who want to learn more about mental health crisis intervention. Attendees can become part of a specialized group (Certified CIT Officers) that is uniquely trained to respond to citizens experiencing a mental health emergency. A variety of instructors, including legal and behavioral health experts, will be on hand to guide you through the week. In addition to the classroom instruction, participants will attend a four-hour shadow experience (on a different date) at one of the local hospitals' crisis units.
